Claire Hayes from Monash University, Melbourne Vic., Australia along with a number of colleagues recently published a paper in *The Journal of Psychiatric & Mental Health Nursing* focused on reviewing the descriptions of adolescent mental health inpatient units in order to identify key defining features. The review and identification of features was used to develop a checklist intended to improve consistency when reporting on adolescent mental health inpatient units. The proposed checklist includes: country and location of inpatient unit, catchment area, admission rates, readmission rates, unit capacity, referral source/s, length of stay, age range, gender, predominant gender, admission criteria, predominant diagnosis, secure status of unit, open or closed groups, staffing and equivalent full time, staffing and equivalent full time, adolescent/staff ratios, shifts, allied health, outcome measures routinely used, intervention/s provided, staff delivering interactions, attached services, facilities, discharge procedures, treatment framework/model of care, unit aims/objectives, unit philosophy, and funding source.
